

## Legal Notice- Public Hearing

New Albany Redevelopment Commission is seeking the input of citizens, organizations, and agencies as it formulates an amendment to its 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan & Fiscal Year 2019 (FY19) One-Year Action Plan for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). Under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, & Economic Security Act (CARES Act) the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has awarded the City of New Albany \$397,196 to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19.

A Public Hearing will be conducted on Tuesday, July 14, 2020 at 2:30 p.m., in the Assembly Room, Room 331, City-County Building to receive public input. The Redevelopment Commission will consider all comments, requests and suggestions made during the Public Hearing as it develops the Plan Amendment.

A DRAFT version of the FY19 Plan Amendment will be made available for public comments once prepared for not less than five (5) days in accordance with HUD guidance for COVID-19. The Amendment will be available on the City's website at [www.cityofnewalbany.com](http://www.cityofnewalbany.com), and in Room 325 City-County Building, New Albany, IN, as well as a summary posted in the News & Tribune.

The Redevelopment Commission may consider the Plan Amendment for adoption at the Commission's July 28, 2020, meeting at 2:30 p.m., in the Assembly Room, Room 331, City-County Building.

All letters received by the Commission will receive a written response from the Redevelopment Commission and will become a copy of the official record of the planning process.

These CDBG funds must be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19 and also meet a National Objective for the use of CDBG funds:

1. The use must primarily benefit persons and/or areas of low- to moderate-income
2. May be used to prevent or eliminate slums or blight
3. May be used to meet needs having particular urgency
